Within Lythe Parish Council boundary In the 30mph speed limit (Doctor's Surgery to Sandside Café) the data showed: • A mean (average) speed of 20/21 mph • An 85%ile speed of 24/25 mph (85% of all vehicles were travelling at less than the 30mph limit).			
	The Clerk confirmed that a Community Speedwatch had been offered by the North Yorkshire Police to the community. Cllr IS, as an individual, had requested data logger installation, and he confirmed that he had also been offered a Community Speedwatch.
